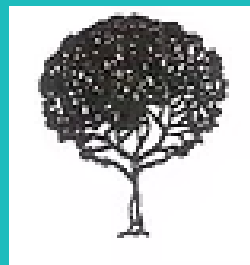

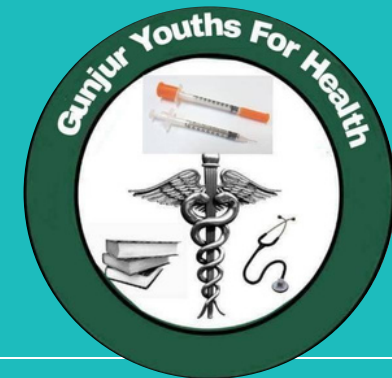

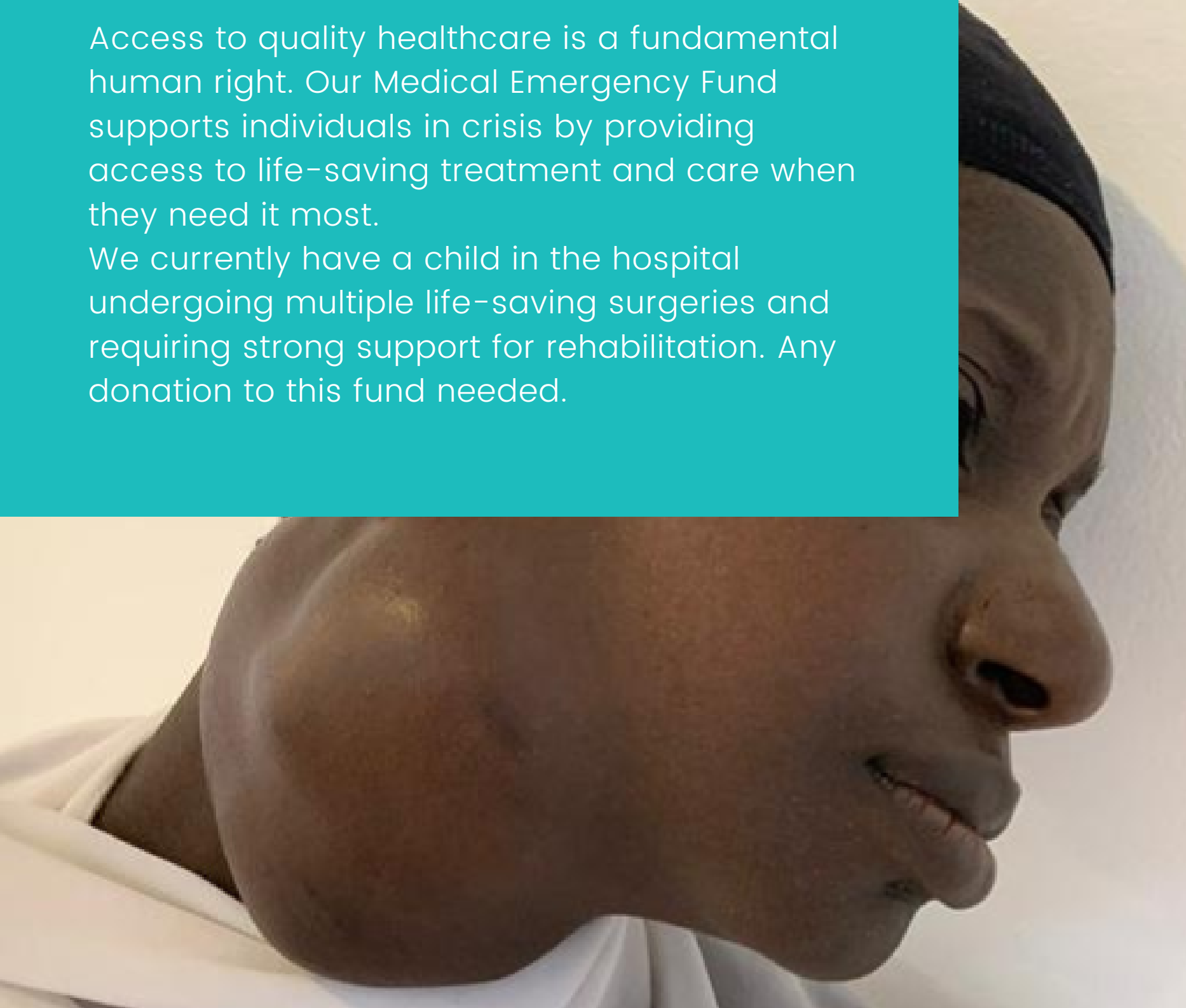

Emergency Medical Fund

Access to quality healthcare is a fundamental human right. Our Medical Emergency Fund supports individuals in crisis by providing access to life-saving treatment and care when they need it most.

We currently have a child in the hospital undergoing multiple life-saving surgeries and requiring strong support for rehabilitation. Any donation to this fund needed.





Women Empowerment



Our Women Empowerment Programs are designed to empower and uplift women, helping them become the best versions of themselves by learning new skills and managing their lives more effectively. We offer a range of programs, including catering, literacy, arts, and crafts, along with a dedicated wellbeing program that supports both physical and mental health. Additionally, when we have medically trained visitors, we take the opportunity to provide open advice sessions, allowing women to ask questions and receive guidance on their health.



Women Empowerment – Jam and chutney



1. Training Costs

- Trainer fees (local expert or external trainer): £500 for a 5-day intensive workshop.
- Training materials: Recipe booklets, hygiene guidelines, food safety pamphlets – £100.
- Subtotal for training: £600

2. Equipment and Supplies

- Sterilization equipment (for jars): £200.
- Ingredients (fruits, sugar, spices) for initial batch: £50.
- Jars: Lodge to recycle
- Labels and printing (design and 500 labels): £40
- Subtotal for equipment and supplies: £290

3. Marketing and Branding

- Logo design and packaging concept: Volunteer intervention
- Printing brochures and promotional materials: £100.
- Subtotal for marketing and branding: £100

4. Operational Costs

- Utility costs (gas & electricity for 3 months): £30.
- Ongoing transportation for supplies/ingredients: £50.
- Fresh food certificate and health screening: £100
- Subtotal for operational costs: £180

5. Contingency Fund (10% of total):

- To cover unexpected costs.
- Estimated contingency: £120

Total Estimated Cost: £1290

Additional Notes:

- Costs can vary based on local availability of supplies, donations of equipment, or subsidies for training.
- Scaling the project (e.g., training more women or producing larger quantities) might increase equipment and operational costs.

Women Empowerment – Menstruation Education and support

1. Empowering Girls Through Menstruation Education and Support
We are seeking funding to support a Women’s Menstruation Education Program in Gunjur. Partnering with Gunjur Youths for Health, we aim to:

- 1 Educate: Host workshops at Gunjur Senior School, engaging each year group to openly discuss the challenges of women's health and break the stigma surrounding menstruation.
- 2 Support: Provide every female student with reusable pads sourced from a small, local business in Gunjur, empowering girls to attend school confidently during their menstrual cycle.
- 3 Empower the Economy: By purchasing reusable pads from a local entrepreneur, this project supports small businesses and creates a sustainable economic impact.

Why This Matters:

- Many girls miss school due to a lack of menstrual resources.
- Raising awareness promotes confidence, hygiene and equality.
- Supporting local businesses fosters community development.

Estimated Cost:

- Workshops and materials for all year groups: £500
- Reusable pads (pack of 6) for approximately 400 students (at £7.60 each): £3040

Administrative and logistical costs: £150.

- Total Funding Needed: £3690

Gunjur Upper Basic School Furniture Project

The school was established in 1970 and currently has 900 students enrolled on morning and afternoon classes. We're working to provide sturdy chairs and benches for students—each set costs approx £55 and accommodates 2 students.

Several classrooms are in urgent need of new furniture. We will partner with local tradespeople to make this happen. The work will then enhance education and boost local businesses, creating opportunities within the community.





16th Edition Annual 4 week Summer school

4th – 29th August 2025 supporting 400+ students. The program costs £3,500 and includes:

- ✓ Breakfast & lunch for all students
- ✓ 10 qualified Gambian teachers
- ✓ Planning meetings & resources
- ✓ Certificates of achievement
- ✓ Specialized workshops with community partners

We are looking for full or part funding of the program: The support helps provide vital learning opportunities and combat summer learning loss.

Capacity Building workshops

We offer a wide range of capacity-building workshops, including first aid, emergency response, career advice, and health screening. These programs are designed to help communities develop essential skills, enhancing their ability to respond to challenges and improve their overall well-being.

First Aid workshop



Hosting workshops in Gambia equips communities with essential, life-saving knowledge. Being prepared in emergencies helps prevent further complications, provide immediate care and reduce long-term risks. These workshops ensure participants stay skilled, confident, and ready to act. Our target audience is a selection of community members including teachers, students, football coaches, police, fire and immigration members, fishermen

Cost Breakdown:

- 1.Venue Hire (GPA community hub and outdoor)
 - 5 days
- 2.Refreshments (Tea, coffee, snacks, water)
 - 50 participants x GMD 50/day x 5 days = GMD 12,500
- 3.Lunch
 - 50 participants x GMD 150/day x 5 days = GMD 37,500
- 4.Facilitators' Allowance
 - 2 facilitators x GMD 800 /day x 5 days = GMD 8,000
- 5.Transport Allowance for Participants
 - 50 participants x GMD 150/day x 5 days = GMD 37,500
- 6.Workshop Materials (stationery, handouts, flipcharts)
 - GMD 5,000
- 7.Miscellaneous (e.g., certificates, admin costs)
 - GMD 5,000

Total Estimated Cost:

GMD 105,500 / £1240
